
# UNITING CPE THE JOHN PAVER CENTRE

# Education and Pastoral Care Formation

Uniting CPE – The John Paver Centre offers Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) programs for pastoral/spiritual care formation. The programme's methodology uses the action-reflection-action model of peer group experiential learning.

The action component is the actual provision of pastoral/spiritual care in a supervised placement setting. The reflection component includes exploring the pastoral/spiritual experience, its dynamics, and the theological and spiritual dimensions. Pastoral/spiritual care formation happens as students develop their identity in the role while integrating their spirituality/theology with their experiences of offering care to vulnerable people. In the process students learn about their own gifts and vulnerabilities and experience personal and professional growth.

The group supervision process helps expand students' world view as they engage with a diverse group of peers. As educators, CPE supervisors create a safe space for students to encounter, explore and learn from the challenges they face.

## **Placement**

The pastoral/spiritual care placement for this program could be in a community setting, either one that the Centre initiates or one that the participant initiates. Applicants already in a pastoral care role may negotiate with the Centre Director and their employer to use this setting as a placement.

The ASACPEV Inc. standards require a minimum of 100 hours of actual face-to-face pastoral care to be provided in the placement.
