

Equitable Access -Caring for all People

Equitable access can increase wider community participation to the use of Church property.



A safe standard of access and egress can help protect persons from injury. As Christians, these considerations are part of showing our love and protection of neighbour, especially for those of our community who are most vulnerable.



An Access Audit is a report prepared by a professionally qualified consultant. It informs Church Councils on all equitable access needs for all types of disability and what is needed to provide dignified access to those in our community with a disability.



Certain access obligations may require urgent attention to protect the safety of all persons, such as handrails, signage or safe access such as compliant stair nosing. All work carried out must comply with the Australian Standard for Access and Mobility : **AS1428.1 – 2009.**



An Access Audit is an essential reference to prepare for a building project. A design prepared by an Architect or Engineer must comply with the Australian Standard for Access and Mobility : AS1428 - 2009 in addition to all Parts of the Building Code of Australia (NCC 2019).



All carparks must provide for an accessible car space (1 for every 50 carspaces). Legislation was adopted to the Building Code of Australia in 2011 requiring that an accessible car space must comply as to Australian Standard for off-street parking for people with disabilities: **AS2890.6-2009.**



Church Councils can locate an accredited access consultant, architect or building surveyor, via their respective professional bodies.
