- Students, migrants and refugees coming to Monash and the local region from other countries face
 culture shock and loneliness away from their friends and families. Older members of the community
 are experiencing great changes in their community as neighbouring properties are sold and converted
 into student housing, causing isolation and loneliness. Addressing these issues remains an on-going
 challenge.
- The congregation's goals include spiritual nurture that embraces and encourages intercultural engagement. Discipleship of those exploring the Christian faith and encouragement to grow in the faith.
- Nurturing and building leadership particularly with younger members.
- Exploring future options for working with students and young families to encourage a sense of community and belonging.
- Succession planning for future leaders.
- To achieve these goals
 - Options for ministry to international students and young families need to be explored.
 - Possible future leaders need to be identified and trained.
 - o A Talent Bank is currently being compiled to help with leadership transition.
 - More opportunities for fellowship are being introduced e.g. lunches following worship.

During COVID there were hardly any new international students, especially when China was in lock-down. In the last six months, 33 new people, mostly students, have attended worship (not all continue to come).

- Development of ministry to students and young families and leadership development.
- Possibility of developing a community garden (plans started before COVID).
- Possibility of re-establishing the Chaplaincy link with the 'Monash University

J The Community

J1 Describe the wider community in which your ministry is located.

The placement is located in the midst of student accommodation, apartments and share houses adjacent to Monash University (Clayton Campus). There is a transient student population with many multicultural families. As homes are sold, many are being converted to apartments, mostly for rental and student accommodation.

J2 What makes this an enjoyable place to live?

The rich diversity of cultures in the City of Monash and especially around the University

Few of the congregational members live in the immediate community. Members who came as students and lived in the area have now bought homes in other suburbs but continue their membership in the church.

Students, migrants and refugees coming to Monash and the local region from other countries face culture shock and loneliness away from their friends and families. Older members of the community are experiencing great changes in their community as neighbouring properties are sold and converted into student housing, causing isolation and loneliness.

J4 How closely does your congregation reflect the demographics of your local area?

The congregation very closely reflects the demographics of the local area in its diversity in cultures, age, languages, mobility, etc.

According to the census, the City of Monash has a much higher average population in the 25 – 54 year age group and also an extremely diverse cultural range, probably due to the University population.

J5 What community facilities are present in the local area?

Clayton North Public School across the road.
