

Who are Nillumbik Network?

We are a newly formed network of three church congregations who are in proximity and share a part of Melbourne characterised by beautiful natural surrounds.

Hurstbridge and Diamond Creek have shared a relationship including a single Church Council for some time, while Eltham and Montmorency Churches amalgamated in 1996. The individual churches will maintain their own identity and governance within the network. The Montmorency site closed in 2016 and later was sold. This assisted in the recent refurbishment of the Eltham Montmorency Church\_which offers new multi-purpose spaces and brand-new amenities like the kitchen, already becoming the hub of hospitality and friendship. The fully fitted-out Op shop within the church recently opened its doors to the community.

Within the network there is a common love for God and a desire to follow Jesus in the way we care for each other and reach out to community. We share a love of our natural environment, and we are committed to its care and conservation. We look forward to deepening our relationship with God and with each other. We share the Gospel message in many varied ways, including regular worship and singing, group activities and fellowship. We seek to be welcoming and inclusive, to share hospitality in our congregations and to find connections with the community.



We need a new Minister to provide us with long-term leadership, spiritual oversight and pastoral care. Diamond Valley has been without a Minister's leadership for over a year, and their Elders and leaders within the Church have done an amazing job in providing faithful and engaging worship. Eltham Montmorency has been fortunate to have several supply Ministers during this time. This was a great support during their displacement while building renovations were made.

This will be an exciting placement with the versatile refurbished church at Eltham Montmorency offering new beginnings, and the potential for many Nillumbik network community connections and hospitality ventures. We have big dreams!

The new Nillumbik Network will open creative ways to work together and support each other. A challenging aspect for a new minister will be to find ways forward, respecting traditions and our aging community, while being new and relevant, enabling us to grow our respective churches

# **C** Mission

#### C1 List three of your missional activities that your congregation does best?

Diamond Valley support local schools with funds for them to allocate as they see fit. Support of Food drives for Eltham Refugees & support of C.A.V.E. (Community and Volunteers of Eltham) are events that provide financial support to families and adolescents.

Community connection through music, and Diamond Valley put on monthly concerts. There is also a good ecumenical connection in Diamond Creek and Hurstbridge that shares special occasions of worship such as the quiet Christmas service for those who find Christmas time difficult. There is a "Food is Free" cupboard outside the manse.

The OP shop provides Community outreach and service. It is in the Eltham Montmorency church building. It is run by UCA and Anglican volunteers, as well as volunteers from the wider community.

#### C2 What are three missional activities your congregation would like to develop?

Hospitality: The new Op Shop area and new multipurpose spaces at Eltham Montmorency create many opportunities for connection with the wider community, potentially spaces for playgroups to use, possible Coffee and Tea for Op shop visitors, including children's story times. We have a small community library box on site with multi-age resources.

Community Outreach and Creativity: At Eltham Montmorency we would like to explore the many Music and Artist connections in the community, and we have submitted plans for the potential lease of a "Heritage Bank Building" on site, as an artist studio. We could explore ways to express our faith through Art and various means of visual expression.

Environmental Care: All congregations have a strong commitment to care for the beautiful natural environment in which we live. We will look at measures that help emissions reduction and support environmental sustainability.

#### C3 How has the congregation changed in the past two years?

Over the last 2 years Diamond Valley has experienced some decrease in numbers through loss of older members. Eltham has maintained similar numbers, where a few left and a few new members have joined.

#### C4 What changes and developments are anticipated in the next three to five years?

The formation of the Nillumbik Network is a new development. We anticipate that we will build strong connections and share in hospitality.

We aim to grow and nurture the spiritual life of our congregations and foster intergenerational worship. We also aim to grow our singing group to enrich regular worship services

Now church renovations are completed, the new multipurpose spaces will open up many opportunities for different uses. The congregation and Church council will discuss and explore this in the near future.

# D The Community

# D1 Describe the wider community in which your ministry is located.

Nillumbik is renowned as the Green Wedge Shire, located 25 kms north-east of Melbourne. Key centres include Eltham and Diamond Creek, as well as rural townships including Hurstbridge and St Andrews

The people of the shire enjoy a healthy, safe, family-friendly lifestyle within close knit communities. Our townships offer residents and visitors distinctive village-style shopping, access to professional services and public transport and places to meet and socialise.

A unique and diverse landscape Nillumbik is also an arts-rich environment. The creative life of the community is highly-valued and large numbers of artists live and work here in the quiet beauty of our landscape.

# D2 What makes this an enjoyable place to live?

The semi-rural areas of the Green Belt planning zone and low population density. Easy access to education centres, shopping facilities, medical facilities, closeness to Austin Hospital and good public transport networks. It has many cafes and community gathering spaces. It has a wide range of local churches and faith communities, sporting clubs and community groups, and access to bike and walking tracks in nature reserves. Annual family friendly community events include the Eltham Rotary Festival, Hurstbridge Wattle Festival, Diamond Creek Rotary Town Fair

# D3 What are the points of stress and pain in the wider community?

Nillumbik has similar stress factors in the community as surrounding areas. The cost-of-living pressures causing food insecurity and financial hardship in schools. It is not immune to family and relationship difficulties and problems with addiction.

# D4 How closely does your congregation reflect the demographics of your local area?

Congregations are older than the community average. Despite the family demographic, we have little contact with children, adolescents and families. This provides potential for outreach and growth.

#### D5 What community facilities are present in the local area?

This is a vibrant community, with many schools, libraries, medical and allied medical services. It has great restaurants, sporting facilities and associated clubs, shopping facilities and community activities. There are many parks and nature reserves for bike riding and walking trails, dog parks and community gathering spaces There is increased housing and growth, including development of new childcare facilities
