There is nothing as raw and honest as some of the prayers in the Psalms. This is the psalm that Jesus cried on the cross, and it captures our sense of suffering and feeling of Godforsakenness. However, we know that God is always with us, just as God was fully with Jesus in his suffering. We have full scriptural warrant to be honestly and frankly pray our feelings to God. It can sometimes feel that God is far away and feel like God seems to be doing nothing to help us. Miracles are something that many of us have yet to experience, and might never get to. Yet, when we let our feelings out in prayer, then it is often the case that the Holy Spirit is able to be at work as comforter,



helper and advocate. May it be for us as for the psalmist, that once the we have been able to vent that our thoughts might shift and likewise we can affirm the prayer "*But you, Lord, do not be far from me. You are my strength; come quickly to help me*"

God Is Not in the Fire or Earthquake

Read 1 Kings 19:11-13

"...but the Lord was not in the fire." - 1 Kings 19: 12 Holy Bible, New International Version® Anglicized, NIV® Copyright © 1979, 1984, 2011 by <u>Biblica, Inc.®</u>

When the Prophet Elijah was facing the hardships of persecution, he sought to withdraw to safety (dare we say run away?) - although with good reason. We may not be facing persecution, but many are facing disaster and suffering. Elijah's story is a reminder that life in the service of God can be hard and that faith is not a guarantee of an easy life. In times of extreme difficulty, including natural disasters, it is good to remember that just as in this story, God is not necessarily in the acts of nature such as fire or earthquake as their direct cause. However, we can believe that God is present in our circumstances as a still small voice, calling those of us who are followers of Jesus, who are the apostolic ("sent out") Church reminding us that God is not just with us but even in the face of hardship, always leads us into the world in mission to share the message of compassion, love, and hope, not only in words, but in our love and good deeds.

When we place our trust in God through the Spirit and in Christ, our saviour, we can find and have hope. This love of God will bring us through all things, even though it might involve time and struggles. May we know that

God is with us and is able to fill our lives and living in ways which help us recover after suffering.

- This we honestly seek to pray.


