Reflecting

The call to discipleship is higher than all other claims upon one's identity and allegiance; and whatever fate awaits teachers or masters also awaits their disciples and slaves. These two ideas are clear in today's gospel reading and as we read the whole exposition of Matthew, an outside observer might wonder why anyone would become a disciple. But the instruction of Jesus is "Do not fear", yes, these things are to be expected, it is not easy to be a disciple but in the call to discipleship there is the promise of each one's importance to God, even the hairs of your head are counted. If God notices each sparrow, worth less than a penny, that falls, God also notices every disciple.

But do not think that you can be a disciple in secret, there is "nothing secret that will not become known". (Matthew 10:26) This may worry those who don't want to be known as disciples, but it is also encouraging, it reassures us that God knows everything that happens, the lies told will be found out, we can stand in confidence on God's side, declaring the gospel. If we tell the gospel in the light, it will be "shouted from the rooftops". (Matthew 10:27) The darkness Matthew refers to is about the meetings that the community had at night because they were a community that was persecuted.

Do not fear, God is on our side even when it does not feel like it and it does not look like it as our congregations are small and battling to survive in today's society. God is always present; however it takes courage to announce our beliefs. Giving of self is self-fulfilment, it is what God requires

and rewards even if there are no rewards in this life. Simplicity, vulnerability, and dependence on God demonstrate the reality of God's presence and character in the face of the world's claims to possess real power. This is hard stuff to understand and to consider putting into practice. Even as laws change and there are court cases around the bad behaviour of those with power, who use it inappropriately, there still seem to be plenty of people who get away with it and gain power and wealth while bending or ignoring the law. We see this as the war in Ukraine continues, young first nations people are still targeted by police, a million-dollar stadium is proposed in Tasmania while aged-care and hospitals cry out for money.

What are we called to do? How are we to be disciples in 2023? If we look at the big picture, there were few disciples in the beginning, but Christianity is now a world-wide religion. In small towns and city suburbs there are still groups of disciples doing what God calls them to do. We know that buildings close, but the people are still there, still caring, offering love and mercy, providing what people need. Our role is to be there, not to fear, to recognise what human power is and to call on God's power, knowing that this may involve conflict and division but sure of God's power to provide mercy and compassion. We must keep connecting to the source of this power, trusting that God is present in every situation however tough or messy as conflict so often is. Keep working, believing, and trusting all you disciples out there!
