Jesus' prayer

Something that always gives me goosebumps and makes me feel privileged is when people whom I respect pray for me. I find this a profound experience, it humbles me and gives me worth, it usually gives me the courage to carry on, it reinforces my faith and is very, very special.

In John 17, Jesus is praying for us, he is interceding on our behalf with God, whom he calls Father. This chapter is not instructions for our behaviour, we have the privilege of overhearing a prayer for all disciples, then and now. Jesus entrusts the hope for the future of his disciples to God in prayer. In this section of John, The Farewell Discourse, Jesus makes promises to his disciples and then entrusts their future to God. As they overheard this prayer for themselves, so we as we read this passage now, overhear the prayer for ourselves.

This is important because, although not giving a direction for behaviour, it gives an insight to understand ourselves in the world. Our life as a community rests in and depends on God's care. This lies at the core of our faith, God cares for our community, God cares whether we exist, we have the same relationship to God, as Jesus did while he was on earth. This is a parent child relationship. Jesus is asking to God to continue the total love gift, which he gave to his disciples, to give to us. I remember

standing with a very small bundle of grandson and suddenly being overwhelmed with love, tears ran down my face as I realised how much love I had for this child. I believe that is the love God has for us and I am overwhelmed.

We are the community for whom Jesus prays. Jesus commends us to God's care and kindness. Jesus is bold enough to hold God to God's promises: "You have given, you have sent, you have loved; now keep, sanctify, let them be one." In this prayer, Jesus opens up his relationship with the Father to include the community by calling on the character and identity of God, which is known to him and in which he desires the community to share. There is an intimacy in this prayer, the confidence Jesus demonstrates of God's presence. Jesus demonstrates in praying for us, that this intimacy is to be strived for, we can be confident of God's presence and then live to demonstrate this confidence.

The wonder of this prayer for me is that Jesus has given my future and our future as community into God's care, that is the strength of Jesus' love for those disciples who overheard the prayer and for us who read it. God's care is so complete that day to day life in this world is possible, God cares about everything that happens and it is in God's care not mine. Jesus has placed us totally in God's care and God's love and care is complete forever. Jesus' prayer is that God, Jesus, and the faith community will truly be one in love.
