Reflecting

In my church experience, there are always disagreements, some minor about whose turn it is to do the flowers, can we move the pews? Others more serious about theology and behaviour. All need to be dealt with, at least talked through. Maybe we need a clear roster, maybe agree to differ, or seriously consider our mission and make new decisions together. However, it is always important to discern, consider, discuss and pray we are all God's people.

After Jesus performs miracles, calls the disciples so that they might be sent out to preach and to cast out demons (Mark 19), he went home. And the crowd followed, in such large numbers that they could not eat. His family tried to restrain him as people were saying "He has gone out of his mind". Jesus 'family were concerned, maybe this was true, Jesus was out of his mind. There was obviously disagreement about who Jesus was and with what power he is healing and performing miracles.

The religious authorities are concerned. The Scribes have come down from Jerusalem to sort out this problem, they maintain that Jesus is using the power of demons to cast out demons. Jesus does not argue with them, quote scripture or perform more signs, he uses logical argument: "How can Satan cast out Satan?" He unmasks the contradictions in the Scribes' thinking. Love is what casts out fear. Jesus' healing hand is reaching out with the awesome and radical power of grace and love.

Jesus talks then in parables how a house divided cannot stand. If we look at our churches today, we are divided. It is wonderful when we come together ecumenically and we find that often we have lots in common, we enjoy each other's company and together we are stronger. They shall know we are Christians by our love, if only we, as the disciples at work could have this impact on our institutions, it's the work on the ground that matters—loving, caring, feeding the hungry, housing the homeless. Jesus comes to awaken a counter-vision, a new way of being and living together, he cannot change the Scribes, so he invites the people into another way of living.

Jesus continues to teach the crowds and his family turns up again. Kinship was the backbone of society in many ancient societies and for Mark this part of the social order is part of what Jesus comes to overturn. Mark's is the gospel that does not include or place importance on genealogies. Jesus will not go to his family, they did after all try to "restrain" him. This social order is not important as it implies insiders and outsiders, something that Jesus' teaching does not allow, he goes to the outskirts of society.

Jesus tells the crowds, those who sat around him that those who claimed him as family were not his "mother and brother", they did not have special claims on him, it is those who listen, who "do the will of God" who are Jesus' community, his "mob".

Jesus overturns traditional beliefs and structures, then, in his time as the earthly Messiah, and now. If we are God's people, whose behaviour and example do we follow?

Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother. (Mark 3:35)
