# Reflecting

The apostles gathered around Jesus, and told him all that they had done and taught.

Mark 6:30 NRSV.

I imagine my grandchildren being collected from school after their first school camp. They can't stand still, it has been so exciting, all the new experiences, the words tumble out as they want to share it.

Thinking about it, I remember coming home from my first Scripture Union camp when I learnt that being a Christian didn't mean going to church but having a personal relationship with the living God. Plenty of people didn't want to listen but I didn't care.

The disciples in the previous chapters have been learning from Jesus, they have seen miracles, healing heard Jesus' call and they have been sent to use their learning. In a study group this week, someone raised the question- why do we not talk about what we learn in church? He continued by saying that we hear God's word in the readings and the reflection and go off and gossip over morning tea. He continued that sometimes he is burning to answer a question I may

have asked or discuss a point that has been raised but he doesn't get the opportunity and then forgets.

There wasn't much response from the group, this is just how it happens. They agreed that they thought the readings and reflection were important and they did think about them. Response to worship was lacking.

I was excited, this was someone who was listening and wanted to learn and we talked a bit about how and when this could happen. A group who sat together, took their cuppa back to the church? Had lunch together? Or met during the week? I do remember a retired minister who would phone the current minister on Sunday afternoons and wanted to analyse all that had been said in great detail. For me, there is a bit of reluctance as it is challenging not to own my reflection, and see comments as criticism, I need to imitate Jesus in turning questions around, in being open to how others see things.

This could be a first step in learning and being willing to talk about our faith, then going out and sharing, inviting someone back to the group where they could see that we are not a closed community but want to talk about our faith. The opportunity to meet with the outsider and demonstrate that we are not called to follow rules but there is an openness and place for diversity and different thinking in our community.

What makes or would make people rush off to follow Jesus, not even thinking about taking a snack with them? This is what the people did in the introduction to today's passage. (remember they didn't have McDonalds or Coffee vans?) They went because the hunger for Jesus and what he offered was greater than their hunger for the physical things of life. Hearing Jesus, learning and being part of the new life he offered was more important than a cuppa!
