Reflecting

Did any of you have "food rules" as you grew up? Only butter or jam on bread? Only tea at breakfast? One lolly after dinner? I'm sure some of you did. These are some I remember and I remember being horrified when children of a friend shared an apple bite by bite! I realise that some came from a household where food had to go a long way and others, as for the apple from a fear of sharing "germs".

These were good reasons to those who made them and the reasons for God's people as defined in the Old Testament were to help God's people to remember that they were different. They were setting them apart as God's people, preserving their faith in God, true creator and living God. They were a people set apart. We find this in other religious groups, they need something to make themselves different. Jesus told his disciples that they did not need these rules

and that some of the rules that the Pharisees were keeping were tradition and not God's rules.

We like to hold onto traditions. The familiarity provides comfort, a hot shower before bed, even picking the first daffodils for my house to remind me of my mum. Traditions give us identity, but we must be careful in our church traditions that they do not become laws, like the ones Jesus is talking about in this passage. We have recently sold the pews in a congregation and moved furniture so that it is a friendlier atmosphere for strangers. We have more groups using our properties and have had to ask people not to park in some areas. All these things have required consultation, discussion and firmness but gradually they happen. Some members feel that we are asking us to change what makes us who we are. Churches have pews, TV sets have no place in this "sacred space", and what about the place where they have always sat?

How much more Jesus is asking of us? Jesus is asking us to change our hearts. Jesus is asking us to forget about all those traditions and to think what really makes us God's people, the faith that brought us all here in the first place. The faith that offers us love and a place in a community of love and relationship with God. Jesus sees through any pretence that we think makes us look like God's people and so do many in the community who have left the church or do not see the point of our practices.

One of the difficulties is that the church is made up of people and Jesus points out that people do not have clean hearts if we look at the list written in Mark:

"It is what comes out of a person that defiles. 21 For it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come: fornication, theft, murder, 22 adultery, avarice, wickedness, deceit, licentiousness, envy, slander, pride, folly.

I think we all hope that most of these things are not within ourselves, they belong in other people but if we look at history, we will find all these in our institution called the church. We have work to do communally so we do not label some as unacceptable as unclean and not worthy of a place in God's kingdom but even more in our own hearts. There is no hierarchy of sin, pride and greed stand alongside murder. My hope for the church is that we can be honest, hear what Jesus is saying to us, examine our hearts and seek God's guidance and help to change not an easy task. But a community of love is something special, a place where all are welcome, not judged but accepted, not required to follow traditions or rules but simply to be themselves, all are worthy of love. May it be so.


