Reflecting

When I was a child I lived in fear of the wrath of God. Scriptures were used to highlight sinfulness, like Romans 3:23: "All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God". The next verse was never quoted: "they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus".

It meant I grew up with an exaggerated need to seek God's forgiveness and even practised asking forgiveness quickly in case I was about to die and had unconfessed sin!

That's no life for a child of God, and it's not what the Scriptures proclaim of God revealed to us through the risen Christ. Now late in the season of Easter, we have been shaped in faith by those changed through the death and resurrection of Jesus. We see that Peter is beginning to see life and hope rather than fear and death. He has had to face his own demons and seek forgiveness, but like the passage from Romans 3, it is no longer sin and falling short that matters, it is gift and redemption through Christ Jesus.

Today's readings explain why. From the gospel of John, Jesus says to us (as disciples) that we are not to think of ourselves as servants who are issued commands and expected to obey, but as friends of Jesus. Friends know and care for one another. Friends share the highs and lows of life together. Friends work together with a mutuality that blesses each other.

Jesus has spoken before of abiding in him, but this goes deeper. The invitation is to abide in his love. As people who follow Jesus, we understand that he reveals the presence, love and intention of God to us. God is not distant; God is not trying to catch us out; God is not saying we are welcome only under certain conditions ...

The disciples have been learning since the resurrection that life wins, that love wins, that the evil and destructive powers of the world can be conquered through our faith in Jesus Christ. The passage from 1 John speaks to this. Building on from the word of the gospel, living as God wants us to is not a chore because it is shaped in the love of God.

If I had been stuck in my childhood faith of distorted judgement and wrath, it would have been exhausting and a great burden. I'm sure I would have given it away long ago if that's all I'd known. But faith has led me to life, and that's a whole other thing!

This is spoken of in 1 John in a more global sense. Who is it that conquers the world? It is this life-affirming, freeing faith that is in Jesus Christ!

It was the disciple Peter who became the rock of the early church, despite three times denying he even knew Jesus. Transformed in love, he found life in Jesus Christ and shared that with a world that needs what Christ offers.

In that same Spirit, walls have come tumbling down, hospitals have been built, justice has come, safe havens have been created. Of course the world could always use more of that - like people who notice things are rough for their neighbours; for people who speak up for Myanmar or any place in crisis; for people who quietly share the love they know in Christ, because sharing it is no burden at all ...

Abiding in the love of Christ - lifts me to be the best version of myself. Let all who follow find their life there that our joy may be complete. And in that, let's bear fruit for the sake of a struggling world.

We join our prayers with your concern for the church, with its varied emphases and institutions, that our works of love may be a joyful service. We pray for those around us; especially any who are bearing a hard burden or pain; hear and use our prayers, that your will may be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Loving God, our prayers continue on, enriched and spurred on by your command and our experience. We ask and listen and act through Jesus, who gave us these words to pray together:
