Reflection:

Never think that the world was without the Spirit before Pentecost! This Spirit who hovered over the waters at creation has been part of the Divine Relationship always. Here in the land we call Australia, the Great South Land of the Holy Spirit, the Spirit was active long before humans ever arrived here. The third point in the Preamble to the Uniting Church Constitution says this....

*"The First Peoples had already encountered the Creator God before the arrival of the colonisers; **the Spirit was already in the land** revealing God to the people through law, custom and ceremony. The same love and grace that was finally and fully revealed in Jesus Christ sustained the First Peoples and gave them particular insights into God's ways."*

Moses is pictured as longing for his people to discern and be in relationship with the Spirit. Nature is shown in the Psalm to be in the rhythm of the Spirit's dance.

So what meaning does Pentecost have? John van der Laar suggests that "Sometimes it feels like the celebration of Pentecost has become an exercise in missing the point. What was a radical, communal, inclusive and world-shifting event has become, in much contemporary practice, an individualist, exclusive, status-quo sustaining experience with little more to commend it than a sense of euphoria." The "Church-birthing impact", the transformational potential which disturbs and challenges has been largely domesticated into something much less likely to cause 'amazement' and empowerment.

This Spirit comes upon us as a community, to enable us to speak each other's language, to be welcoming and serving no matter who we are. We work together to serve and empower those who most need compassion.

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Reflection continued

This Spirit is a 'sending' Spirit, accessible to us, just like the early church believers, to take the love of God out into the world. This Spirit unites us as the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12 v 3b -13), celebrating our differences and our gifts and talents. The gift of the Spirit is not for holding to ourselves but for demonstrating the diversity of the Body in compassion and service. The Spirit is the energy in us for loving and including the marginalised and the different, the diseased and rejected, the poor and the vulnerable.

This Spirit is not for the 'raising up' into a specially favoured group but for taking us out, to connect with those we need extra strength and inclination to relate with. As van der Laar suggests, Pentecost doesn't take us out of the world into small rooms of worship but rather takes us back into the world to be the hands and feet of God, to live the prophetic message of God' Kingdom with Jesus the Christ as our example.

This Spirit, present always, is showered upon us to bring us together, to invite us further into the Dance, and empower us to go, using the gifts and talents She bestows on us, and to share the love of Christ.

In these days of shut-in we find this to be a bit tougher. Let's use this time as a prophetic time of grace, grace which blesses the environment through the pause in human affairs. A pause to bless this environment which is shown in the Psalm as being known and loved by God with all of creation in its belonging place. As we pause let us gather strength in the Spirit to listen, to discern our gifts and ways we can use them, both now and in the coming days of our community's economic, and emotional and psychological, recovery.

Holy Dove, we ask you to "Come", and you direct us to "go". Let us draw on You to unite us in your grace and to direct our paths out into the word to love, and to serve others.
