I sometimes catch myself obsessing about matters that are actually as dry as dust, or looking for fulfilment or meaning in things that are ultimately futile. Jesus said, "I am the Bread of Life." Sometimes it can be a challenge to really take that simple reassurance to heart.

Reflection:
