

There is a **Royal Commission** about issues that affect people with disability.



A Royal Commission means the government made a group to find out about issues that are very important to everyone in the country.



People with disability have been part of the Royal Commission.



The Royal Commission will help everyone to know what they must do to make sure people with disability

• feel part of their community



get the support they need

• have their human rights met.



You can tell the Royal Commission if you are **not** happy about how you have been treated.

You can tell the Royal Commission about bad things that have happened to you.

• neglect.
