Acknowledging

As we gather, we acknowledge the traditional custodians of this land and these waters. We pay respect to elders past, present and emerging. As First and Second Peoples walking together, we commit ourselves to be people of the covenant, listening, truth telling and seeking justice for all.



Reading notes

The readings for today are lengthy, especially the gospel passage. This liturgy focusses on the John's telling of Jesus' arrest, betrayal and crucifixion. It is set into smaller parts with encouragement to use different voices in its telling.

For example, in the first part of John 18:

Narrator: Jesus went out with his disciples to a place where there was a garden. Now Judas, who betrayed him, also knew the place, because Jesus often met there with his disciples.

So Judas brought a detachment of soldiers together with police from the chief priests and the Pharisees, and they came there with lanterns and torches and weapons.

Then Jesus, knowing all that was to happen to him, came forward and asked them,

Jesus: 'For whom are you looking?'

Judas and company: 'Jesus of Nazareth.'

Sending Out

So, in this time of in-between, a place of vigil, we offer our prayers of hope and light for the world. And we allow the Scriptures to uphold us until we meet again on the third day.

Listening

Hebrews 10:16-25

After the reading we depart in silence

'This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the Lord: I will put my laws in their hearts, and I will write them on their minds', he also adds,

'I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more.'

Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin.

Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.


